

Greetings from the Governor

In Coastal Georgia, the Savannah Convention Center is a magnet for tourism, investment, and economic development. During the pandemic, as travel came to a standstill and group gatherings were indefinitely postponed, local leaders utilized the Savannah Convention Center as a meal preparation hub and supply distribution center to support those struggling to weather the economic storm created by COVID-19 containment efforts. Even in these challenging times, the Savannah Convention Center finds a way to bring value and opportunity to the local community and beyond.

With an expansion project underway, the future of the Savannah Convention Center is bright. This investment will yield an incredible economic return for our state, ensure an outstanding experience for our visitors, and create a bright future for all Georgians.





"It was the best of times, it was the worst of times."

So begins the classic "The Tale of Two Cities" by Charles Dickens. The sentence also summarizes the fiscal year 2020 for the Savannah Convention Center.

The first eight months of the year were fantastic. We were beating our budget significantly and headed for operational positive cash flow for only the second time since opening in 2000. We were having our absolute best year ever. It was the best of times.

Then March arrived with the COVID-19 virus. St Patrick's Day was canceled, and with it, the Hibernian Society Banquet. The cancellations mounted, and rescheduling began. Many of the rescheduled events were also canceled. It was the worst of times.

Our staff rose to the occasion. Emergency planning was implemented. Extensive cleaning and sanitation protocols were established. We eventually attained Global Biorisk Advisory Council (GBAC) certification for creating and maintaining a rigorous and effective cleaning, disinfection, and infectious disease prevention program. During the year, we worked closely with Governor Kemp's office on our expansion. We kept them informed of our progress on the plans and the anticipated pricing of our addition. We secured a commitment from the Governor's office for a \$70 million allocation in the state bond package to enable us to begin construction of the new building in 2021.

The pandemic interrupted the Legislative session before a budget could be passed. When the Legislature returned in June, our appropriation was approved. It was the best of times.

Thank you Governor Kemp; thank you Speaker Ralston, Majority Leader Burns, Delegation Dean Ron Stephens, and the entire Georgia House of Representatives. Thank you Lt. Governor Geoff Duncan, Senators Watson and Jackson, and the entire Georgia State Senate. We appreciate your vision for and confidence in the Savannah Convention Center.

We now turn our attention to executing the expansion. Construction plans are complete, and pricing has been secured by Clark Construction. We are ready to pour concrete. Opening is

scheduled for the summer of 2023. The task before us now is to bring the project in ahead of schedule and under budget.

I cannot write enough good things about Sherrie Spinks and the incredible staff she has assembled. They have gone above and beyond the call of duty with our customers, employees, and facilities in this time of unprecedented turmoil.

I would also like to acknowledge Frank Poe and the staff of the Georgia World Congress Center for providing oversight, direction, insight, and support to the Savannah Convention Center.

We believe we will experience a sharp recovery when the pandemic subsides. We believe there is tremendous pent-up demand for meeting events and trade shows. The pandemic has proven that people are social creatures and demand interaction socially and economically.

or the past six years, the Georgia World Congress Center Authority has served in a management role with the Savannah Convention Center – a business relationship that links the state's two most popular visitor destinations and drives new business and tax revenues into the economy. This partnership has seen its share of successes and a few challenges along the way, but nothing that could have prepared us for 2020.

Despite the ramifications of a global pandemic quelling what was to be the best financial year on record, the Savannah Convention Center's collective spirit could not be broken. From the team members' resolve to assist customers with rebooking canceled events and re-imagining shows with social distancing protocols in place to achieving GBAC STAR[™] accreditation, the Center's focus on delivering exceptional service paid off with shows returning to the venue over the summer.

The Center gained momentum on its expansion project during the fiscal year thanks to the General Assembly's approval of additional bond funds. The vision for a larger venue will double the size of exhibit hall space and undoubtedly bring new business and other revenue to the city, region, and state is coming into focus.

Tourism is a staple of Georgia's economy and workforce, generating \$63 billion in annual economic impact to the state, supporting 460,000 jobs in Georgia, over 28,000 of those in the Savannah area. To keep this vital industry growing, we must remain competitive. For tourism to thrive, we must expand one of Georgia's most prized facilities.

AVANNAH CONVENTION CENTER

Between 2017 and 2019, the Georgia General Assembly approved \$24 million for design and planning. In 2020, Governor Kemp and the Legislators approved another \$70 million to begin construction, and the project is now underway.

The \$271 million-dollar expansion will double the exhibit hall space to accommodate more extensive indoor exhibits and attendees, fund a 40,000 square-foot ballroom, 15 new meeting rooms, and a 900-space parking garage.

Upon completion, the expanded Savannah Convention Center will make our city, region, and state the ideal place for some of the world's largest and most respected businesses and organizations to visit, invest, or relocate. This expansion will create an economic benefit in our community with more shoppers, more diners, more customers, and more jobs.

The Savannah Convention Center's economic impact will generate more funds created in sales tax revenue for our local schools, public safety, increased investments in tourism, more infrastructure projects, and recreation. Every dollar spent will generate more economic opportunity for Coastal Georgia families and all of Georgia and impact every corner of our state. The return on the investment will be tremendous and obvious.

Georgia is the top state for business and a leader in agriculture, aerospace, cybersecurity, manufacturing, and tourism. Tourism can be greatly enhanced by expanding the Savannah Convention Center. With local, regional, and statewide support and collaboration, we can foster growth, generate opportunity, and ensure prosperity for generations to come.






Expansion Timeline


