"It was the best of times, it was the worst of times."

50 begins the classic "The Tale of Two Cities" by Charles Dickens. The sentence also summarizes fiscal year 2020 for the Savannah Georgia Convention Center.

The first eight months of the year were fantastic. We were beating our budget significantly and headed for operational positive cash flow for only the second time since opening in 2000. We were having our absolute best year ever. It was the best of times.

Then March arrived with the COVID19 virus. St Patrick's Day was canceled and with it the Hibernian Society Banquet. The cancellations mounted and rescheduling began. Many of the rescheduled events were also canceled. It was the worst of times.

Our staff rose to the occasion. Emergency planning was implemented. Extensive cleaning and sanitation protocols were established. We eventually attained Global Bio-risk Advisory Council (GBAC) certification for cleanliness.

During the year we worked closely with Governor Kemp's office on our expansion. We kept them informed of our progress on the plans and the anticipated pricing of our addition. We secured a commitment from the Governor's office for a \$70 million allocation in the state bond package. This would enable us to begin construction in fiscal 2021.

The pandemic interrupted the Legislative session before a budget could be passed. When the Legislature returned in June our appropriation was approved. It was the best of times.

Thank you, Governor Kemp, Thank you Speaker Ralston, Majority Leader Burns, Delegation Dean Ron Stephens and the entire Georgia House of Representatives. Thank you, Lt Governor Geoff Duncan, Senators Watson and Jackson and the entire Georgia State Senate. We appreciate your vision for and confidence in the Savannah Georgia Convention Center.

We now turn our attention to executing the expansion. Construction plans are complete, pricing has been secured by Clark Construction. We are ready to pour concrete. Opening is scheduled for the summer of 2023. The task before us now is to bring the project in ahead of schedule and under budget.

I cannot write enough good things about Sherrie Spinks and the incredible staff she has assembled. They have gone above and beyond the call of duty with our customers, employees and facilities in this time of unprecedented turmoil.

I would also like to acknowledge Frank Poe and the staff of the Georgia World Congress Center for providing oversight, direction, insight and support to the Savannah Georgia Convention Center.

We believe we will experience a sharp recovery when the pandemic subsides. We believe there is tremendous pent-up demand for meeting events and trade shows. The pandemic has proven that people are social creatures and demand interaction socially and economically. We look forward to the return to normalcy with great confidence. We will be ready!

Wow-what a year! The Savannah Convention Center was on track to have its best year yet for revenue, room nights and net profit but wham, a worldwide pandemic. It was something none of us could have anticipated. Unfortunately, this led to a crazy time with many cancellations and postponements and put the center in a very different position. The bright side is I have a strong staff passionate about their work and will manage to get us through this crisis. Only 18 staff members working on all projects have tested our resilience and determination to get us back on our feet. The center received the Global Biorisk Advisory Council STAR Accreditation. The GBAC Star accreditation enables facilities to create and maintain an effective cleaning, disinfection, and infectious disease prevention program. The GBAC accreditation has been a significant factor in making groups feel comfortable in returning to the convention center...."Come Be our

This is also a time to celebrate Governor Kemp and the Georgia Assembly's approval of the FY21 budget for the State of Georgia, which included \$70 million to continue with our facility expansion. Already underway is

the placement of new cooling towers and relocation of electrical and gas utilities. A groundbreaking scheduled for the fall will kick-off the full construction process with completion of the expanded facility expected in early 2023. The new development will double the building's size offering the opportunity to host larger groups and more simultaneous events. The construction project will bring 600 new jobs to Georgia and create significate Economic Impact to the region and Georgia. Additionally, the convention center will be able to continue to host events –come "Be our Guest".

Our theme this year is "Be Our Guest." We practice this motto daily, offering the most satisfactory service to our clients and attendees. We excel in our customer survey scores and continue to train our employees on first-class service.

We are working diligently through these times to assure customers we can social distance and provide a safe environment. We are confident fiscal year 2021 will be a good year with events remaining in place....We hope you will "Be our Guest" in FY21 and Beyond.


2000 Savannah International Trade and Convention Center opened


