CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

I am pleased to provide this report on the Savannah-Georgia Convention Center Authority.

Our fiscal year ending June 2023 was another year of exceptional performance for the Convention Center. We ended the year with a slight operating loss but beat our budget by \$546,950. This is a remarkable achievement, given that we were under heavy construction the entire year.

This operating performance is directly attributable to our dedicated team of professionals and staff. Unfortunately, our General Manager, Sherrie Spinks, retired this past August after 9 1/2 years of reliable service. Sherrie provided the leadership and drive to ensure the Center achieved its maximum potential. Her leadership, maximizing the performance of your Center led us to determine that expansion was warranted. Sherrie played a critical role in designing the expansion, securing the funding, keeping an eye on construction, and solving the resulting operational challenges. Sherrie will be sorely missed! We wish her all the best in her welldeserved retirement. While a national

search is conducted for a General Manager, our CFO of 22 years, Mr. Stephen Hall, will serve as interim General Manager.

I want to thank my fellow Authority members: Mr. Joe Marinelli, Vice Chairman; Mr. Bert Brantley, Secretary-Treasurer; Mrs. Anne Scheer, Mrs. Ruth Quattlebaum, Commissioner Pat Farrell; Mr. Martin Miller, Mr. Ben Polote, Mr. Pritpal Singh, Mr. Trip Tollison, and Mr. Ansley Williams. They are excellent stewards of your convention center.

Of course, we could only be under construction with continued appropriations from the State of Georgia. We thank our local delegation led by Representative Ron Stephens, supported by Senators Ben Watson and Derek Mallow, Representatives Jesse Petrea, Bill Hitchens, Carl Gilliard, Edna Jackson, and Anne Westbrook for keeping our funding request in front of the legislature.

We look forward to 2024 and all future years with confidence. We are excited to open our expanded convention center in the 2nd guarter of 2024. Presently, we have

38 groups booked that would only be meeting in our Center with the expanded space.

After seven years of effort, we are developing a 400-room hotel. The Authority has determined it will follow the successful format established by the Georgia World Congress Center. The GWCC will open a 975-room Signia Hotel by Hilton in January on the site of the former Georgia Dome. The GWCC will own this hotel. The hotel was financed with bonds sold by Citicorp to private investors, a substantial contribution from the Hilton Hotel Corp, and a cash infusion from the GWCC.

The Savannah-Georgia Convention Center will own our hotel. Citicorp and Hilton will underwrite it. The financial plan will include bonds sold to private investors and a contribution from Hilton. Rather than a cash donation, the Savannah-Georgia Convention Center Authority will guarantee approximately 15% of the bonds issued by pledging a portion of its hotel-motel tax. This hotel is necessary to ensure the maximum performance of the expanded

GIVING BACK

The Savannah Convention Center is proud to make a huge difference by giving back to its local community, region, state, and beyond. For starters, the economic impact in 2023 was \$200.9 million.

Looking closer at specific numbers reveals the significant contributions to local companies and employees. For example:

- The Food and Beverage team employed approximately 250 to 350 temporary staff per month, depending on the needs of clients and events. The Savannah Convention Center's budget for temporary payroll is \$736,331, an average of \$61,360 per month.
- In fall 2023, Savannah Convention Center jobs contributed to an area unemployment rate of 3.5, which is .4 lower than the national average, according to the US Bureau of Labor Statistics.
- The Savannah Convention Center expansion project has awarded \$122M in contracts to First-Tier Georgia Contractors, with \$70M going to Savannah companies. The following is a complete list of these contractors.

TOPPING OUT

Cranes and construction fencing continued to be part of our landscape in 2023 as the \$276 million Savannah Convention Center expansion moved closer to its projected opening in spring 2024.

More than 1.5 million person-hours through June 2023 have resulted in many milestones at 1 International Drive.

Notably, the expansion project reached its highest physical point (its "topping out") in early March, approximately one year after the groundbreaking. To celebrate, the Savannah Convention Center and Visit Savannah partnered to create an exciting milestone event for local media, meeting planners, and city officials. Georgia Governor Brian P. Kemp spoke to the crowd and signed the "final beam" in the expansion.

This project has awarded \$122M in contracts to first-tier Georgia Contractors, with \$70M remaining in Savannah. When complete, the expansion will double the size of the building, including exhibit hall space, add a 58 ft. wide hanger door to accommodate more extensive indoor exhibits and equipment, add a 40,000 square foot ballroom, 15 meeting rooms, and a 900-space parking garage.

Savannah Convention Center's fiscal year was earmarked by remarkable progress on its expansion project, including a topping-out ceremony in March. Soon, current and new shows will have more space and opportunities for innovation, collaboration, and connection, creating increased revenue as well as economic impact to the region and the state of Georgia. Currently, more than 38 events anticipated to generate more than \$97.9 million of economic impact to the region have been booked into the new expansion space - a testament to the dedication and talent of the Savannah Convention Center team. As we celebrate the extension of our partnership with the Savannah Convention Center, we are committed to pushing the boundaries of what's possible, exploring new horizons, and continuing to be the driving force behind Georgia's tourism industry. We are in the home stretch in the race to complete our much-anticipated expansion of the Savannah

Convention Center. Even with construction all around us, we have had a fantastic year hosting a record number of events and breaking records. We replaced the 22-year-old roof, repainted the inside of the building, installed a new outdoor event space on the riverfront, and completed many other projects. 
